

A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

Councilmembers Phil Mendelson and Jim Graham introduced the following bill, which was referred to the Committee on _____.

To prohibit the District of Columbia to transmit arrest data with the United States Department of Homeland Security, Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Secure Communities Act of 2010".

Sec. 2. Definitions.

(a) For the purposes of this act, the term:

(1) "Arrest data" means data collected by the District of Columbia during the arrest and booking processes, including personal information and fingerprints.

(2) "ICE" means Immigration and Customs Enforcement under the authority of the United States Department of Homeland Security.

Sec. 3. Prohibited.

The District of Columbia shall not transmit arrest data for an individual to ICE.

Sec. 4. This act shall have no fiscal impact.

Sec. 5. Effective Date.

This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of a veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 60-day period of Congressional review as provided in section 602(c)(2) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(2) and publication in the District of Columbia Register.
